

Dual Credit



What is dual credit?

Jean Massieu Academy has partnered with Tarrant County College to provide the opportunity for high school students to take college course while still in high school. Courses may be taken online or at the Tarrant County College Campus. Successful completion of a college level course can earn a student high school credit as well as college credit.

What are the benefits?

- Building a college transcript while still in high school
- Experiencing college curriculum and exposure to rigorous classes
- Earn credits towards an Associate or Baccalaureate degree or technical certificate
- May shorten the time to attain a college degree

Who is eligible for dual credit?

Students who:

- Meet the entrance requirements of the institution of higher learning
- Have the approval of the high school principal or designee
- Demonstrate college readiness through meeting TSI requirements
- Have taken the appropriate pre-requisite HS courses if applicable

How many dual credit courses is a student allowed to take?

Students may take a maximum of 6 credit hours (2 courses) per semester. Please consult with Mr. Williams to determine the appropriate course load.

What is the cost for dual enrollment courses?

The cost of a course is determined by Tarrant County College. Current courses are approximately \$192 per 3 credit hours for Tarrant County residents. Students are also responsible for the cost of textbooks and other course materials. Financial assistance is available.
